

Common Household & Garden Poisons

Chocolate; coffee grounds; xylitol; antifreeze*; tobacco, cigarettes, cigars; snail, ant & rodent poisons

Cats

Acetaminophen (Tylenol) one tablet (325 mg) can be dangerous to a 7 pound cat.

Lilies of any kind and any part, including pollen can cause kidney failure and can be fatal.

Dogs

Grapes, raisins and onions can be fatal to dogs.

Potentially fatal plants

Azalea, Oleander, Mistletoe, Sago Palm, Easter Lily, Yew
